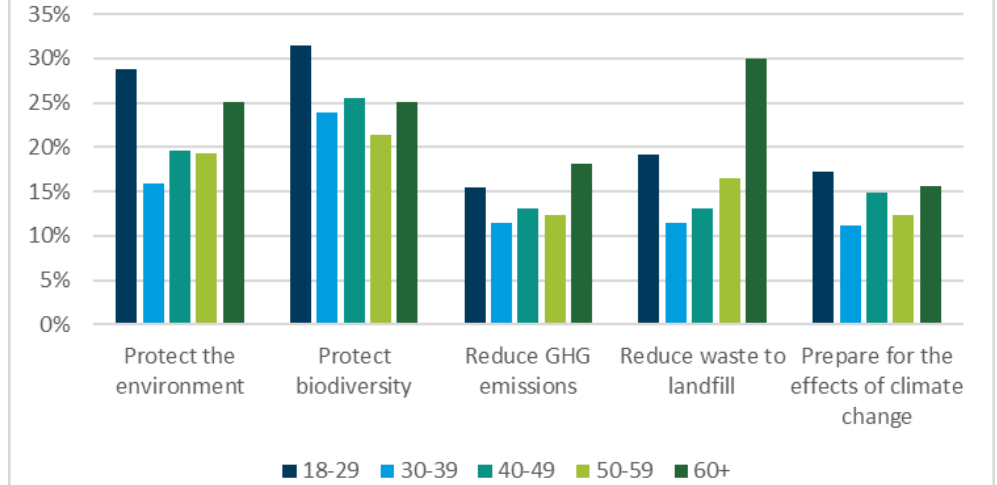

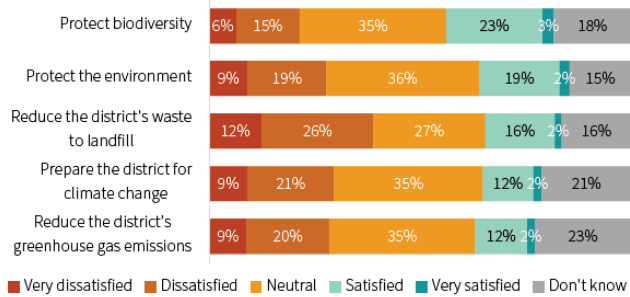
Concern with the impact of climate change



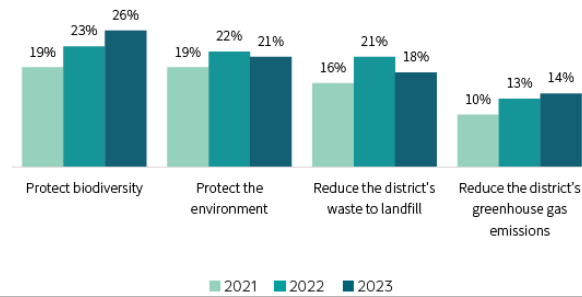
Satisfaction with QLDC steps by age

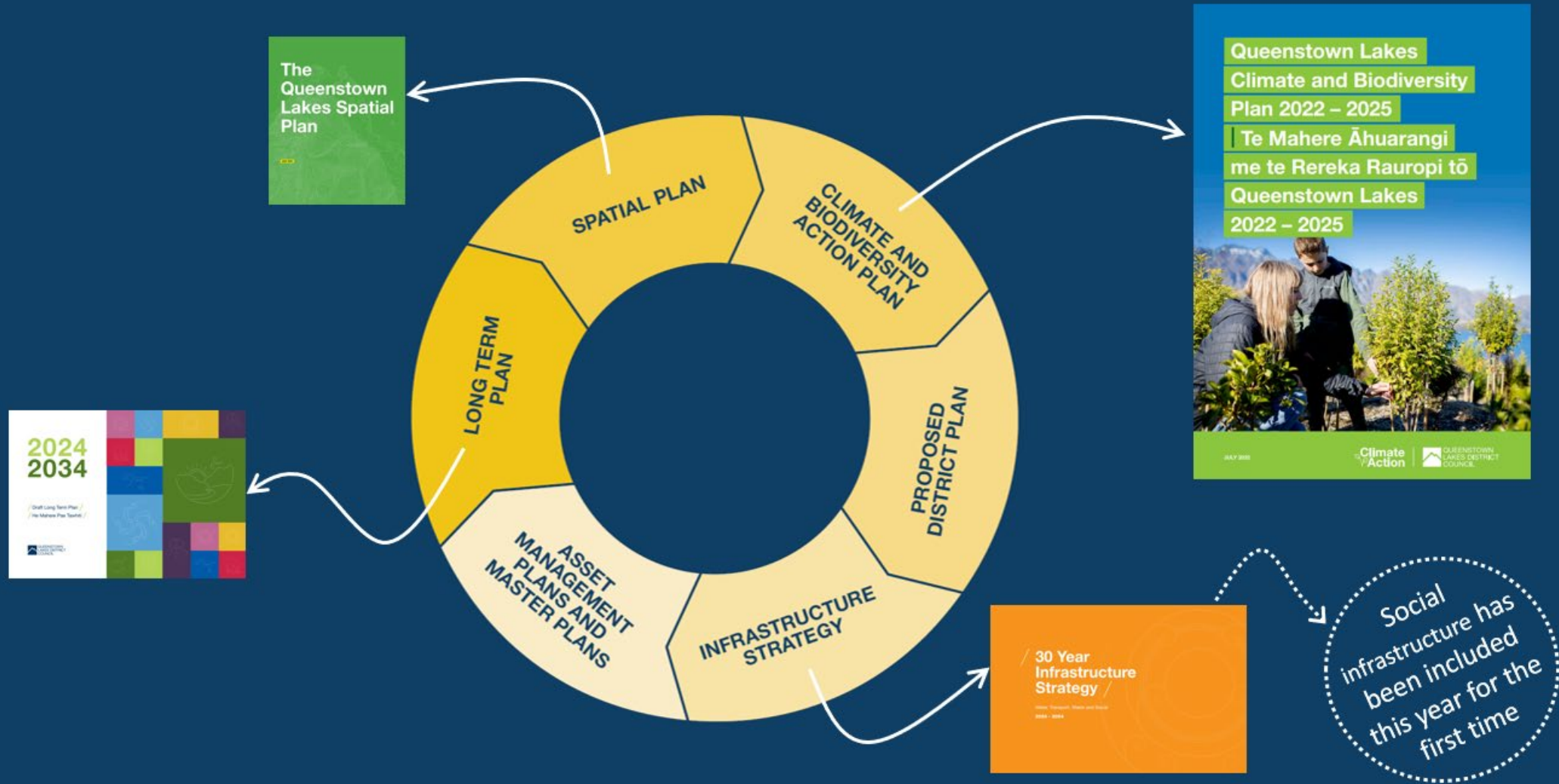
Year on year trend (satisfied and very satisfied)
