1. The Abinghurst Trust wishes to be a party under section 274 of the Resource Management Act 1991 ("**Act**") to the following proceedings:
  - a. An appeal by J C Breen Family Trust ("**Appellant**") against a decision of the Queenstown Lakes District Council ("**Council**") on its Proposed District Plan ("**Plan**").
2. The Abinghurst Trust is a person who has an interest in the proceedings that is greater than the interest the general public has as The Abinghurst Trust owns the property at 21D Gordon Road, Wanaka (Legal Description: Unit D Deposited Plan 378910) and is a member of the body corporate for 21 Gordon Road, Body Corporate 378910. This land is within the proposed General Industrial Zone which is the subject of the Appellant's Appeal.
3. The Abinghurst Trust is not a trade competitor for the purpose of Section 308C or 308CA of the Act.
4. The Abinghurst Trust is interested in all of the proceedings.
5. The Abinghurst Trust supports the relief sought by the Appellant because –
  - a. The Abinghurst Trust agrees that a zone in this part in of Wanaka that is more permissive in relation to office, commercial, retail and other related land uses is more appropriate in terms of existing use, future demand and management of adverse effects.
  - b. The Abinghurst Trust agrees that the decision fails to have appropriate regard to the general character of the land to the west of Ballantyne Road, which is a mix of service, industrial, commercial, office and retail more appropriately suited to a more permissive zone framework.
6. The Abinghurst Trust agrees to participate in mediation or other alternative dispute resolution of the proceedings.
